You will see...

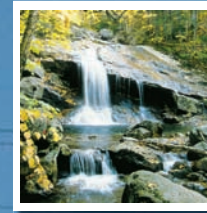
- TUCKERMAN RAVINE:** Hiking into this "bowl" is an annual rite of spring for many expert skiers and riders. There's often snow there in August.
- LION HEAD:** A glimpse of this profile of the king of the cats can be seen from the base of the Mt. Washington Auto Road. This is the most popular hiking trail to the summit of Mt. Washington.
- MT. WASHINGTON SUMMIT:** The 6,288-foot summit is "Home of the World's Worst Weather," the highest state park in New Hampshire and the famous Mt. Washington Observatory, where the second highest wind ever recorded was clocked at 231 miles per hour!
- HUNTINGTON RAVINE:** The cliffs, which form the headwall of this ravine, make this the steepest hiking trail on Mt. Washington and is a favorite for rock and ice climbers.
- THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL:** From Wildcat Mountain's summit, walk along a section of this famous trail with family and friends! This 2,160-mile trail from Georgia to Maine traverses Wildcat Mountain along the Wildcat Ridge Trail.

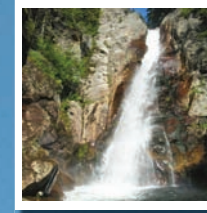

THOMPSON FALLS
Take the Wildcat Mountain self-guided trail to this picturesque series of cascades located about a mile from Wildcat Mountain's base. Look for the sign just across the bridge.



GLEN ELLIS FALLS
Come visit the waterfalls of Pinkham Notch. Experience the 70-foot Glen Ellis Falls, located about two miles south of Wildcat Mountain on Route 16. It's an easy hike from the public parking area.



Wildcat Mountain's 50 trails and glades, with ample natural snow, deliver beginner skiers the thrill of the 2.75-mile Polecat Trail, intermediates a cruise on the 2,112-foot vertical Lynx, and expert purists the historic and original Wildcat Trail. Ride New England's most powerful Quad chairlift to the 4,000+ foot summit in just over six minutes.

Wildcat Mountain ZipRider

NEW HAMPSHIRE'S UNIQUE THRILL RIDE!

Wildcat Mountain's amazing ZipRider zip-line cable ride brings you a whole new world, combining exhilarating feelings of flight and beautiful scenery. The Wildcat Mountain ZipRider descends 2,100 feet over the trails, treetops and the Peabody River to a landing platform located a short distance from the Main Base Lodge. Riders travel on cables suspended at heights up to 70 feet on a 12 percent grade, and reach speeds up to 45 miles per hour. The Snowcat Triple chairlift brings riders to the start deck of the ZipRider.

ZIPRIDER RATES \$20, All Ages

HEIGHT AND WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS
Riders must weigh between 75 and 275 pounds, be at least 52" tall and no more than 80" tall. Weather conditions may at times require increased minimum weight/height restrictions for safety and operation.
